



## Downloading the Images

After you take pictures with a digital camera you have to download the images into your computer. Some cameras are able to connect directly to the computer and download the images. Some of our cameras will do that, but the process takes some time so to speed things up we will use card readers. The card readers that we have are able to read various types of cards. Most likely our readers will be able to read the card from your camera. Our Digital Rebel cameras use a card that's called CF. Below are the instructions for those cameras, but they should be similar to any other cards as well.

### Steps for Downloading:

1. Upon returning to the room, locate a card reader. They can be checked out from Sheri in her office. See the photo below, Fig. #1, to see what some of the card readers looks like.
2. Plug the end of the connection cord (See letter A) into the USB slot on the front of the tower.

3. Take out the card from the camera by opening the door on the card right side of the camera. The Canon cards come out by pushing a button below the card. See Fig. #2

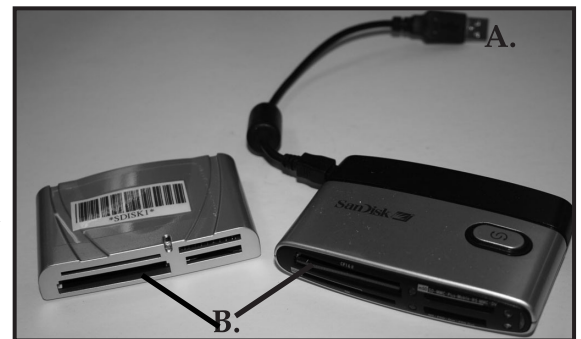


Fig. #1 Card Readers

4. Put the card in the appropriate slot for the card you are using. The card goes in the slot marked with the letter B in Fig. #1. If you put the cards in correctly the light on the card reader should blink and a white icon will show up on the "Desktop".

5. With OSX a program called "iPhoto" will start after you insert the card into the card reader. We will not be using this program so go ahead and quit it.

6. Next open up the white icon (double click) that represents the card. Locate and double click on a folder named "DCIM". Open the next folder and locate your images. Drag your images to the LRF that you created for your assignment.

7. After you have the images in your folder, drag the images to the "Trash" and empty the trash.

- 8.. **IMPORTANT!!!!!!** When you are ready to take the card out, you must drag the white icon to the "Trash" or "Eject" symbol on the dock.
