



## Web Design HTML Part 2

Now we will continue to add to our HTML lesson from Part 1. In this lesson you will learn to add HTML links to your document, add images, add tables and other things. **Remember to save ALL your work in the LRF folder for this assignment.**

To start with create two new documents. Name one as “Link1.html” and the other as “Link2.html”.

Using the “Test” document that you made in Part I, we will be linking to the new documents. Let’s prepare the new documents by giving each a color. Add the code needed to create a different color and text for each of the documents.

### **Making a Title for each of the document’s window:**

The code to make a title in the document window is `<title></title>` with the name of the title to in between the `><`. For each of the documents that we will be using go ahead and give them the title of the documents name. Then try it in Safari or Explorer to see if it worked. If it works correctly you will see on the top of the window the name of the document.

### **Adding an Image:**

Web pages without images are not very interesting so we will add an image to one of the documents. Let’s use the “Link1” document for this. The code for adding an image is `` With the align part aligning an image: left, right, center; bottom, top, middle. Let’s use one of your images to try this. Write out your code as follows: `` **The image.jpg is one of your images you did in the “Web Ready” lesson and MUST be placed within your LRF folder.**

Now add another image to the “Link2” document. Use another one of your images and treat it the same as above coding.

### **Changing Font Color:**

We won’t want to always use the same black font color. Do change the color of the font we use this code `<body text=?>` with the ? mark being the number for the color like you did with the background color earlier. Lets try this as our font color- `<body text=#FF0000>` Do this on the “Link1” document then do a different color on the “Link2” document.

### **Making a Link:**

We will need to make links between our web pages. Let’s create a “Text Link” using the following text: “Link to 2”, The code for this is `<a href="Link2.htm">Link to 2</a>` . Notice that the name of the document that we are linking to is in quotes. Then we follow with the text that we are using to link with. Again make sure that all of the documents are in the same folder or it won’t work. If you get it to work

then make a link to the “Link2” document. Then make links so that you can navigate to each of the documents from all of them.

### **Changing the Starting Color of a Link:**

You may have noticed that there was a different color for the link when you made the text into a link. There is a default color for each browser. You can let the browsers decide the color of links or you can make it a special color yourself. Here is the code for making the links have their own color. **<body link=?>** Where the ? is you will type the code number of the color.

### **Changing the Clicked Color of the Link:**

After a link has been clicked on it is good to have it change to a different color to indicate to the viewer which links have been clicked on. This code will change the color of clicked links.

**<body vlink=?>** Again the ? is where you will put the code for the color. Add this code to your documents.
