



## Using Layers

Thus far you have been limited as to how you can put the text and images on the web page. With Layers you have more flexibility to place your text and images where ever you want.

**LRF:** The LRF for this lesson should be called “YourName.Layers”.

**Images folder:** Create a folder within the LRF called “Images”. Place 3 images to use for this lesson. Make sure the images are small. Some where around 2 or 3 inches for the images.

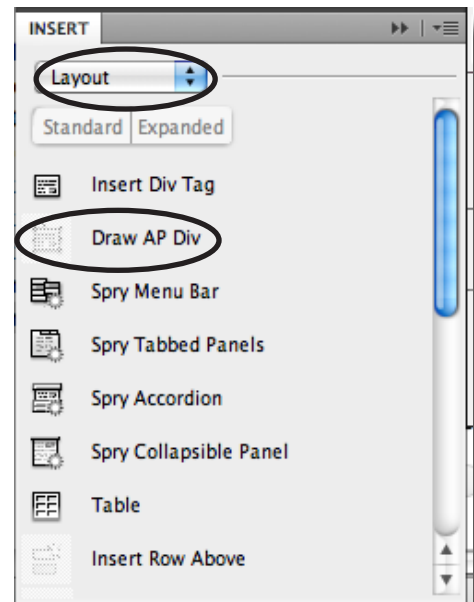
**Site Management:** Go through the Site Management step up in Dreamweaver for this lesson.

**Examples Images:** Locate 3 images that you will be using for this lesson. Use some of the images that you used in your first project. Copy and paste these images into your Images folder that is in the LRF for this lesson.

**Opening Page:** Save the opening page as “index.html”.

**Make a layer:** In the "Insert" window click on "Layout" tab see Fig. #1. Next click on the icon near where it says "Draw AP Div". Your cursor will change to a + and you can go to the page your working on then click and drag a rectangle as seen in Fig. #2.



Click with the cursor inside the layer box and then type in something. You will notice that the text is typing within the layer. Now you can move the layer to wherever you want by clicking and dragging the little square in the upper left of the layer box. Try moving the layer to a different location.

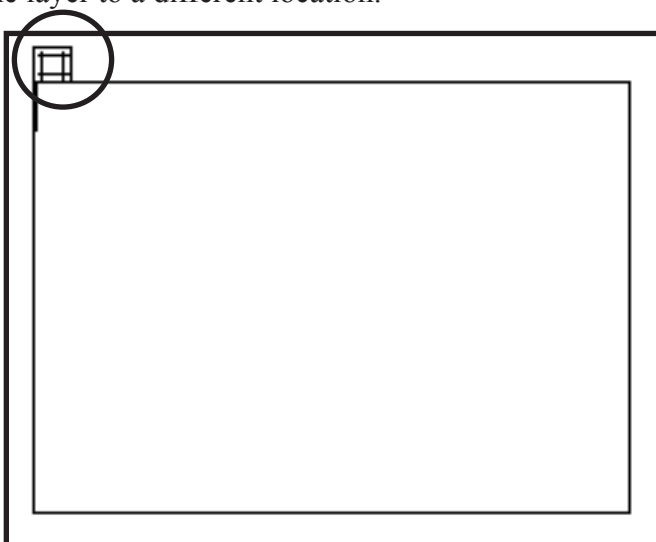
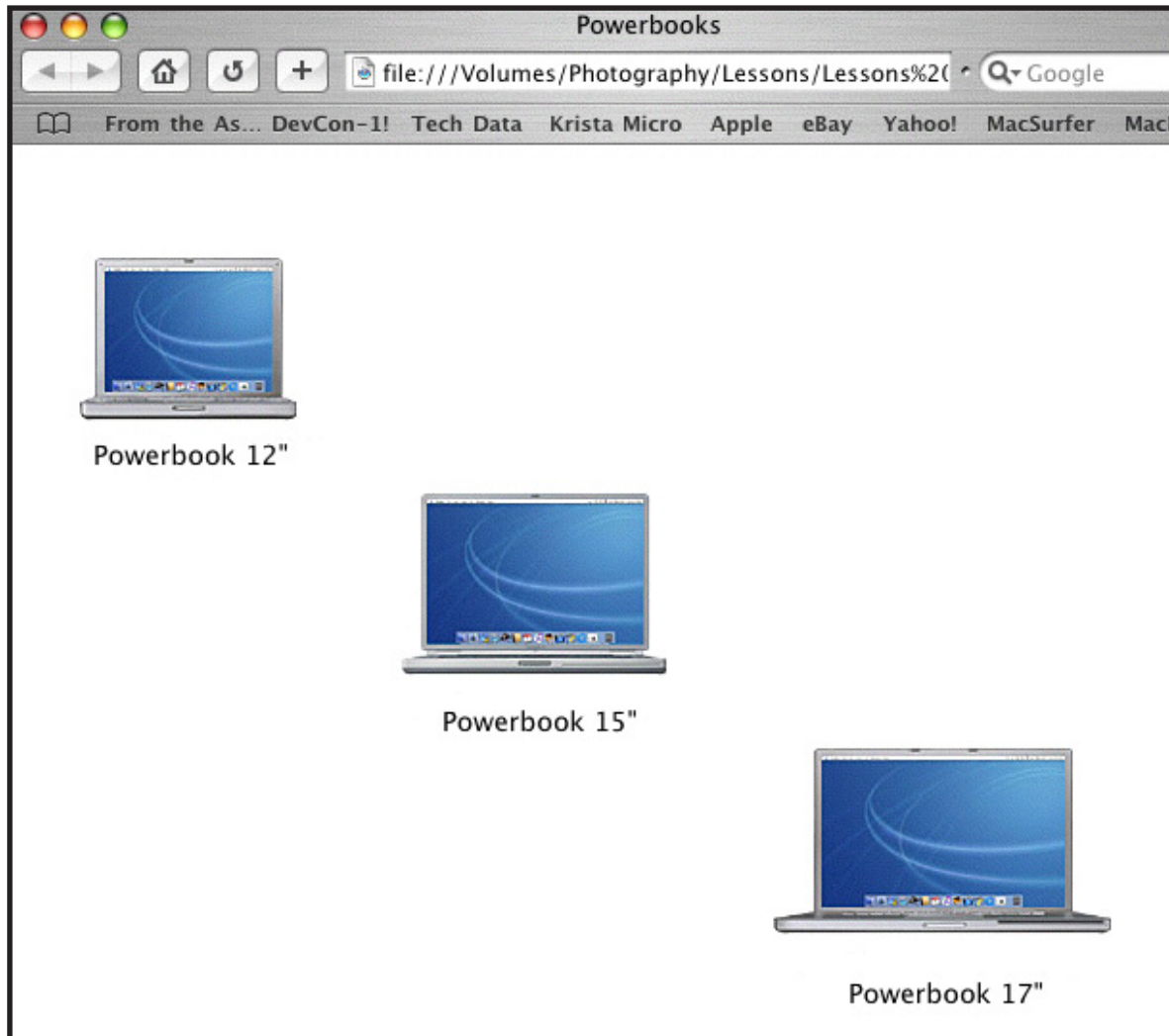

**Inserting Images within Layers:** Make another layer. Click inside the layer box and go to the “Image” button and click on it. Locate the images that are in your “Images” folder. Click on one. Then click on “Choose”. The image should show up in the layer box that you were clicked on.

**Show what you learned:** Now I want you to show what you learned from this lesson. Using layers you are to make your “index.html” have two more images similar to what you see in the image below.
